Artis Gives \$200K in Grants Toward Contemporary Israeli Art



Artis, a New York– and Tel Aviv–based nonprofit that promotes contemporary art from Israel, has awarded \$200,000 to artists, researchers, and institutions though its annual grant program. A \$1 million donation from an anonymous giver in February expanded this year's award and will sustain the prize over the next three years.

"We are proud to build on our legacy of grants of \$1.25 million to over 200 landmark exhibitions and projects in 20 countries with more direct support for artists, exhibitions and international exchange," said Yael Reinharz, executive director of Artis, in a press release.
